They will take a national exam that may qualify them to become members of the U.S. National Chemistry Olympiad Team that will compete in the 50th IChO competition, July 19-29, 2018 in Prague, Czech Republic.

The IChO involves a series of theoretical exams, laboratory exercises, and other activities aimed at identifying the best chemistry students from participating nations from around the world. The U. S. has participated in this event since 1984. In 2017, a total of 293 students represented 75 countries at the 49th IChO, in Nakhon Pathon, Thailand, All members of the U.S. Team won gold medals. This was the best performance in the history of the U.S. Team!

Our 13 local nominees are among over 1,200 nationwide that will take a national qualifying exam April 14-25, 2018 to select 20 finalists. These twenty students will be identified and will undergo intensive training June 10 - June 25, 2018 at the US Force Academy in Colorado Springs, Colorado. The top four students will be chosen to represent U.S. in the 50th IChO competition, July 19-29, 2018 in Prague, Czech Republic.
