The 2002 Nobel Prize in Chemistry has been awarded to three scientists — John B. Fenn, Koichi Tanaka, and Curt Wüthrich — for their contribution to the development of methods for identification and structure analyses of biological macromolecules. Mass spectrometry and nuclear magnetic resonance, the work areas of this year's Nobel laureates, enable chemists to identify and understand the large protein molecules that form the basis of life in every living organism.
