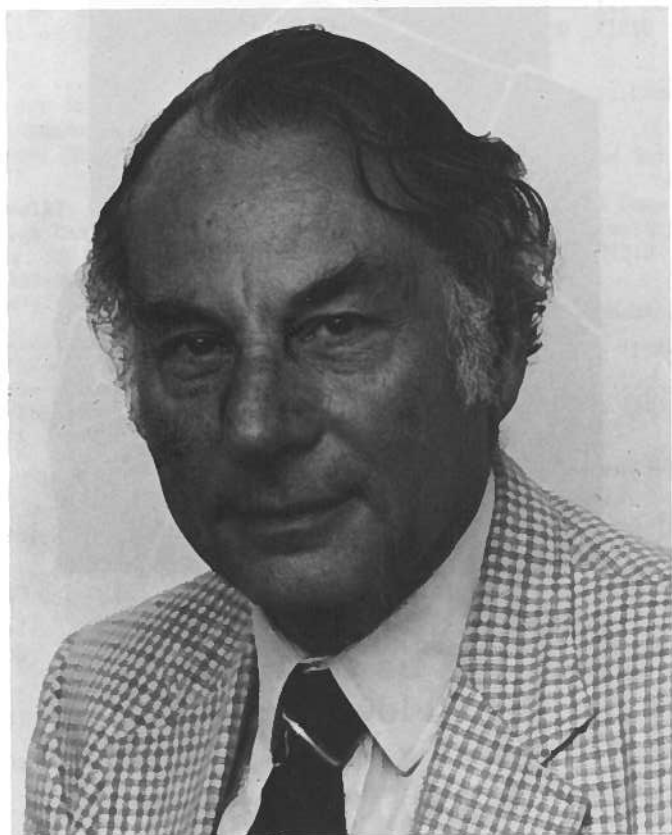

ERNEST L. ELIEL

Ernest L. Eliel is a professor in the Department of Chemistry at University of North Carolina.

Dr. Eliel is an organic chemist, who received the Ph.D. degree at University of Illinois. He served as professor of chemistry and Head of Department of Chemistry at University of Notre Dame.

Eliel's research interests include stereochemistry, asymmetric synthesis, conformational analysis, NMR spectroscopy, organosulfur chemistry, and carbanion chemistry.

He is the author of several well-known books on stereochemistry and has published over 300 research papers and reviews. He has received numerous distinguished awards including the Laurent Lavoisier Medal of the French Chemical Society, and Honorary D.Sc. degree from Duke University.

He was the President of the American Chemical Society, 1992. He is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Chemistry (UK).

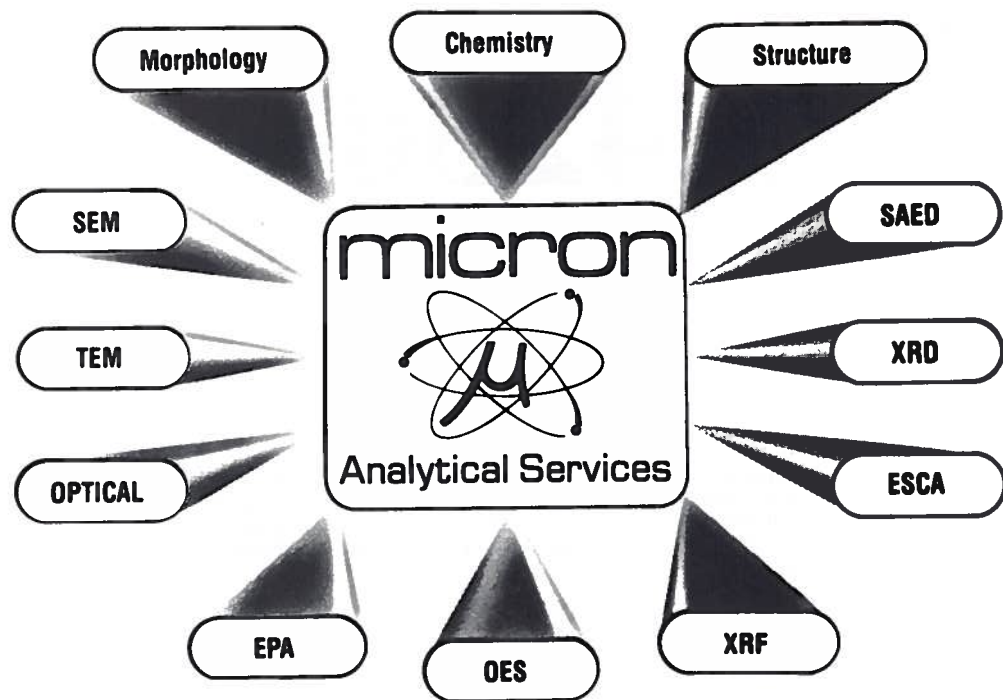
